

Frequently Asked Questions - For the conversion to ISO/IEC 27001:2022

- Q. What is the publication date of ISO/IEC 27001:2022?
- A. The publication date of ISO/IEC 27001:2022 is 25 October 2022.
- Q. When will ISO/IEC 27001:2013 be obsolete?
- A. ISO/IEC 27001:2013 will be obsolete on 31 October 2025.
- Q. Is there any expiry date of ISO/IEC 27001:2013 certificate?
- A. All certificates of ISO/IEC 27001:2013 will be expired on 31 October 2025.
- Q. Is there any transition period for conversion to ISO/IEC 27001:2022?
- A. There will be a 3-year transition period for the organizations certified to ISO/IEC 27001:2013 to convert to ISO/IEC 27001:2022. As per the requirements of IAF and CNAS, the conversion audit shall include at least an additional 0.5 manday to confirm transition of the certified clients when the transition is done during a surveillance audit or as a separate audit. If your organization wants to have a separate conversion audit, please contact our Customer Service for arrangement; or our Customer Service will confirm the conversion arrangement with you when the annual surveillance audit is scheduled.
- Q. What preparation is needed from the certified organizations for the conversion audit?
- A. The organizations shall conduct a gap analysis and identify the need for changes to their ISMS as per ISO/IEC 27001:2022 (e.g. documentation updates such as Statement of Applicability, risk treatment plan). During the conversion audit, the auditors will also confirm the implementation and effectiveness of the new or changed controls chosen by the organizations.
- Q. Will nonconformity(ies) be raised against ISO/IEC 27001:2022 during conversion audit?
- A. During the conversion audit, auditors shall raise nonconformities if it is found that the requirements of ISO/IEC 27001:2022 are not fulfilled, and our normal nonconformities and corrective action plans handling processes will be followed.
